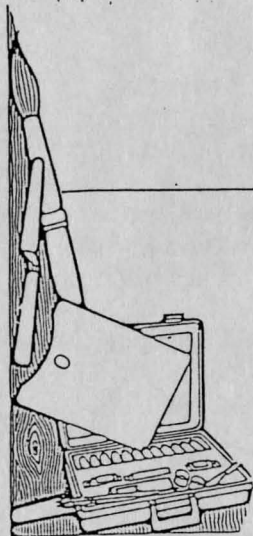

Artworks will be displayed in the Cowichan Campus CAFETERIA

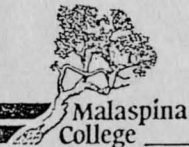
Artworks do not necessarily have to be framed or matted
